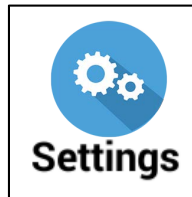
### Overview

Use the App's Settings feature to change the password for your account.


### Change Your Password

1. From the home screen, tap the Settings icon.

2. Tap the **Password** field.



### Password Strength Tips

**The keys to a strong password are length and complexity.**

- Whenever possible, use six characters or more.
- Include punctuation marks and/or numbers.
- Mix capital and lowercase letters.
- Create a unique acronym.
- Include similar looking substitutions, such as the number zero for the letter 'O' or '\$' for the letter 'S'.
- Include phonetic replacements, such as '2Bor!2b' for 'To be or not to be'.



## Change Your **South Central App** Password

Android

### **Avoid creating passwords that use:**

- Dictionary words in any language.
- Words spelled backwards, common misspellings, and abbreviations.
- Sequences or repeated characters. Examples: 12345678, 222222, abcdefg, or adjacent letters on your keyboard (qwerty).
- Personal information. Your name, birthday, driver's license, passport number, or similar information.

### **Tips for keeping your password secure:**

- Don't use the same password for everything.
- Change your password often.
- Never tell your password to anyone.
- Never write your password down.
- Never send your password by email.
