



Foundation year in review

In 2021, the South Central Power Company Foundation donated more than \$625,000 to make a difference in our communities. With those donations, the foundation assisted 109 community groups or individuals with grants and provided 100 scholarships to high school seniors. The funds for the grants and scholarships come from the generous donations of members who choose to “round up” their bills to the next dollar.

One organization that benefited from a grant is the Sunny Day Project at Bloom-Carroll Local School District, which provides services to foster teenagers in Fairfield County.

Many times when teens are placed into foster care, they do not have basic supplies for school or even personal hygiene products. The Sunny Day Project provides those items for foster teens through donations and grants. The organization, located in Carroll, Ohio, recently received a \$3,000 grant from South Central Power Company Foundation.

“Teenagers are often overlooked, and we started the program to be a ray of sunshine in their lives,” says Sunny Day Project Advisor Stephanie Dinsmore. “Thanks to the grant, we were able to purchase personal hygiene products like shampoo and deodorant, school supplies, book bags, suitcases, duffel bags, fidget spinners (to help with anxiety), and hats, gloves, and socks for winter.”



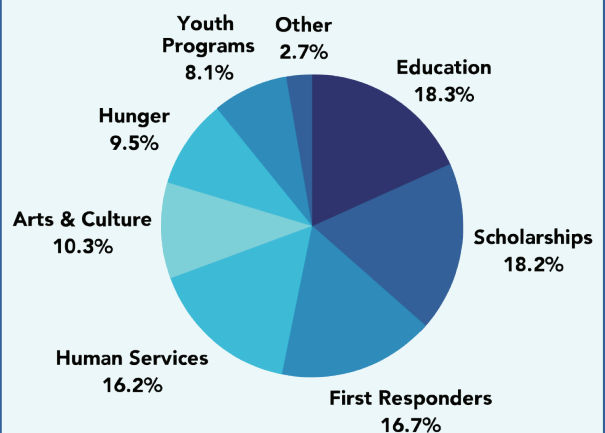
Year in review
